

# Identifying Relevant Perspectives



Use the following table to identify who is currently engaged in understanding and addressing your Targeted Problem, and who still needs to be engaged in your efforts to achieve your goals.

<b>Targeted Problem:</b>		
<b>Prioritized Groups experiencing most inequities:</b>		
	Who is <u>currently engaged</u> in understanding and addressing the targeted problem?	Who else <u>still needs to be engaged</u> in understanding and addressing the targeted problem?
<b>Directly Experiencing</b> the problem		
<b>Providing</b> services to those experiencing the problem (e.g., direct service providers across relevant sectors)		
<b>Supporting</b> those experiencing the problem at the neighborhood level (e.g., faith-based, neighborhood organizations)		
<b>Deciding</b> on changes and how resources are used (e.g., leaders of local cross-sector institutions or organizations, funders, elected officials)		
<b>Opposing</b> targeted changes (e.g., those benefiting from the status quo)
