Equity vs. Equality Checklist



Equity is when everyone has a fair and just opportunity for health and wellbeing, while equality involves giving everyone the same things. A focus on equality only promotes fairness when everyone starts from the same place and needs the same things (which rarely happens in our society; Annie E. Casey Foundation, 2014).

Use the following checklist to see which aspects of a policy, program, plan, intervention, or strategy are equity focused vs. equality focused. Mark an "X" in the table below next to which statements apply.
