Shared Vision Talking Points



Use these talking points to talk with others about your community's Shared Vision

What is a shared vision and why is it important?

A **shared vision** supports local change by bringing stakeholders together to clarify WHAT changes we want to see in the community and HOW these changes will come about.

Shared Visions:

- Help us come up with **SHARED OUTCOMES** to guide our work
- Trigger the design of MULTIPLE STRATEGIES to transform our community
- Motivate people and organizations for COLLECTIVE ACTION
- Raise up the PERSPECTIVES of individuals experiencing inequities

Here is how we got started creating shared vision for our community:

A group of [#] people from local organizations and groups came together to develop a Shared Vision around a healthy community.

We envisioned a future scenario where each child, youth, adult, and family in our community is thriving. There are no meaningful differences in health and wellbeing between people of different races, genders, income levels, LGBTQ status, immigration status or other characteristics.

Then we identified what we would see different across people, organizations, environments, and systems that would bring about this new reality. Here are some of the things we identified:
